3)	Resolution – Increases to Minimum Wage Effective January 21, 2024
	On May 3, 2023, Governor Hochul signed Bill S4006/A3006 into law known as the FY 2024 New York State Budget Bill, modified Labor Law Section 652, which sets forth the minimum wage for employees in New York State.
	Whereas , the current hourly rate of pay for Nassau Community College student aides and federal work study employees is \$15.00 per hour for on- and off-campus employment; and
	Whereas , New York State minimum wage will increase on January 1, 2024 to \$16.00, on January 1, 2025 to \$16.50; and on January 1, 2026 to \$17.00; and
	Whereas, a student must be paid at least the Federal minimum wage under the Federal Work Study Program as required by 34 CFR 675.24(b), and under 34 CFR 675.20(c), the student's work must also be governed by employment conditions including pay, that are appropriate in terms of, among other things, the applicable federal, state, or local law; and
	Whereas, government institutions are not subject to the provisions of the State's Minimum Wage Act, pursuant to the state regulation 12 NYCPR section 142-2.14(b); and
	Whereas, Nassau Community College is committed to provide opportunities at competitive rates to Nassau Community College students participating in the Federal Work Study Program or employed as student aids; and
	Be It Resolved, that the Nassau Community College Board of Trustees Finance and Capital Committee recommends that the full Board of Trustees authorizes the increase in the hourly rate of pay for Nassau Community College student aides and Federal Work Study employees to New York State minimum wage effective January 1, 2024 to \$16.00, on January 1, 2025 to \$16.50; and on January 1, 2026 to \$17.00 for on- and off-campus employment.
