Finance and Capital Committee

The current food service contract expires at the end of May this year. The College desires a dining program that provides a high level of creativity and imagination from a contractor that has a record of innovation and an entrepreneurial approach to higher education dining. CulinArt has committed to make an initial capital investment of up to \$1,500,000.00 to be amortized over the term of the agreement (10 years max). Annual amortization will be netted against the revenue to result in net payments to NCC over the term of the agreement.
