PURPOSE

The purpose of this Policy is to define Nassau Community College's practice with respect to assignment of student credit and contact hours.

POLICY

Nassau Community College's calculations of credit and contact hours is consistent with the State University of New York (SUNY) Credit/Contact Hour Policy (Credit/Contact Hour), the New York State Education Department's Regulations (NYS Commissioner of Education Regulations §50.1(o) and §52.2(c)(4)), and the United States Department of Education Regulations (Code of Federal Regulations §600.2).

Nassau Community College generally follows a semester system with fall and spring semesters consisting of a minimum of 15 weeks, which includes one week for exams. Semesters include two cycles which are approximately seven weeks long but nonetheless adhere to the practice in terms of the amount of work required. The summer session is approximately two months and includes sessions of varying lengths, which adhere to the practice in terms of meeting times and the amount of work required.

Individual departments are responsible for developing, maintaining and evaluating the curriculum within an academic program. However, the Board of Trustees, or its representative retains final control and approval of the curriculum.

The below table of students' course-related work expectations summarizes how credit hours translate for a credit course in various course configurations.
