To apply for an Income Adjustment Review:

- Student must be a matriculated student, enrolled in the 2019/2020 year at the time of request
- Meeting satisfactory academic standards for Federal financial aid
- Have a 2019/2020 FAFSA with a valid EFC for the aid year on file
- If selected, the verification process must be completed before an income adjustment can be reviewed or considered
- Conflicting information must be satisfied
- **Complete this Income Adjustment Request form**
- **The individual for whom the income adjustment is being requested must attach a signed and legible narrative of his/her projected income for the current tax year and submit with supporting documentation**

A Financial Aid Administrator’s decision regarding adjustments is final and cannot be appealed to the US Department of Education.

Samples of Reasons and Supporting Documentation for an Income Adjustment

Note: If requesting an income adjustment review after October 1, 2019, you must also submit your 2017 & 2019 Tax Return Transcripts OR a signed copy of IRS form 1040, 1040A or 1040EZ, along with all W-2's and schedules for those years.

Loss of Employment

In 2019, the student, parent or spouse lost their job and is now collecting unemployment benefits. Submit the following supporting documentation:

- Letters from prior employers, stating termination dates and the last pay stub received
- Unemployment recap showing amount of benefits received and the estimated amount of unemployment expected to receive in 2019
- 2017 Federal Tax Return Transcript

Change in Employment Schedule

The student, parent or spouse had their work-schedule reduced or overtime is no longer available.

Submit the following supporting documentation:

- Letters from current employers explaining the reduction in income and the timeframe it will be in effect
- 2017 Federal Tax Return Transcript

Divorce or Separation

Submit the following supporting documentation:

- If divorced, a copy of divorce decree. If separated, a signed statement from the attorney showing the date of separation
- Proof of separate residence and date one of the individuals moved out
- Both parties 2017 Federal Tax Return Transcripts
- All related w-2 forms & earning statements

Death of a Parent or Spouse

Submit the following supporting documentation:

- A death certificate
- 2017 Federal Tax Return Transcripts
- All related w-2 forms & earning statements.

Medical Expenses Not Covered by Insurance

A member of the family household is very ill and needs special care that insurance does not cover. Submit the following supporting documentation:

- 2017 Tax Return Transcript
- Schedule A of the 2017 federal tax return

Loss of Untaxed Income

A benefit, such as social security, that was received in 2017, has since terminated.

Submit the following supporting documentation:

- A letter from the agency that provided untaxable benefits received in 2017 but stopped in 2019

Private Grammar /High school Expenses

Submit the following supporting documentation:

- A statement from the private grammar or high school indicating the total amount of tuition paid by the parent during the calendar year 2017 for the **student's sibling(s)**

One-time Event: Inheritance, Gift or Withdrawal from Retirement Account

Submit the following supporting documentation:

- Copy of relevant paperwork indicating this is a one-time event
- Documentation showing how the funds were applied. ie: Funding a Retirement Savings, paying down large debt
- Asset form that pertains to the Parent or Student requesting the review. The form can be obtained on our Financial Aid forms page at www.ncc.edu/financialaid

Attach required documentation to completed form and return to the Financial Aid Office, **Make sure the student's NCC ID (N#) is on all pages of documentation submitted.**
