Send the digital image of your work by May 8, 2020 to Gallery@ncc.edu FROM YOUR NCC BANNER EMAIL only and attach the entry form. You will be notified of acceptance of your work via your NCC email. Entries from any other email account will not be accepted. Whether you work is included in the exhibit, or not, you will receive Forum credit for entering. Be sure to include the name of your Instructor(s) to be notified of Forum credit.

SUGGESTIONS FOR PHOTOGRAPHING YOUR WORK:

Your artwork should be photographed with a clean, neutral colored background. If you are photographing indoors, do so in a room with plenty of windows and natural light. Photographing your artwork outdoors when it is cloudy or overcast, with indirect sunlight provides the best lighting. Natural light can be a beautiful way to photograph your work as long as it is indirect. Your images need to be clean, that is without distracting background and in sharp focus. You can use your cell phone if you do not have access to a digital camera.
